Ronnie claimed third place in 2:48:49 and blew the chance of a better placing by taking a bum route on the first hill. The bold Kevin hauled himself back from being fully 15 minutes behind at the first hill to bravely avoid the wooden spoon. Epic decending on the last hill and a superb sprint finish in the dinghies saw him catch the Fife pair of Gordon Greig and Chris Fox to take 6th place in 3:13:57.

If you want to try next year get in early because there is only a limited number of local boats available. Other than that, find yourself a yachty person who will sail you around in a Wayfarer dinghy.

place, from Lomond's Neil Martin, in a time of 10hrs 15mins 3sec. Pete was 2nd Westie in 11:42:21 with a great run by Captain Archie taking third in 13:30:40. Elsie was first wumin only two minutes behind Archie followed by Alisdair, 14:39:31, Isobell and Tony both on 15:10:10 (what were they doing at the back?).

Conditions were hot, with bracken and flies for company. Parts of the route were not as kind as I had thought and no access areas proved awkward. Moreover next year (Alisdair) the race will be earlier in June, and negotiation with landowners may make life a lot easier for the second day. A route change to the summit of Cairnoch Hill is also being implemented to avoid 'that' fire break.

Only Lesley and myself marshalled and time kept, with Kevin sweeping on the first day. Hopefully some running members can volunteer for such duties next year and make life a bit more pleasant for me! A big thanks to all who gave advice and support when things were grim during the planning stage.

Low Alpine Mountain Marathon

Lochaber was the setting for this years LAMM and saw 323 teams (two and a half of which Westies) competing over the spectacular terrain of the Nevis Range. Continuing the LAMM tradition of unusual transport to the start, the Friday night campsite was at 2000ft reached by the Aonach Mor gondola - midge free but a bit of a hassle as overnight gear had to be transported back down to the carpark in the morning.

Saturday brought rain, mist, and interesting navigation as the courses (Elite, A,B,C and D) contoured their way around the

side of the Aonachs, across Glen Nevis, and up onto the Mamores, the wet rock making some of the scrambling descents rather tricky. Overnight camp was by the scenic (if midge infected) Meananach Bothy, where John Donnelly and myself met up with Pete and Keith who were on the elite course. There was no sign, however, of the other Westie team of Stevie Bell and Dave Rogers, and we discovered later that they'd had to drop out after Stevie's dodgy ankle had swollen up.

Sunday was mist-free and the routes headed north, converging on the Larig Leacach allowing for the longest runnable section of the weekend, before a relentless climb up onto the Grey Corries ridge just below Stob Coire na Gaibhre. From here it was a question of route choice whether to go round or over the Corries, before a steep descent off Stob Coire Easain leading down into more runnable terrain, and a fast finish (for some) along the disused railway line back to the Aonach Mor carpark.

Congratulations to Keith and Pete who finished the Elite course in 12hrs 46.16 to win the vet's prize.
